Lesson Plan: 5th Grade Graffiti

Students will demonstrate their knowledge of graffiti art by creating a piece of their own. Content will be based on research of various kinds of graffiti art.

Materials (what you need)

12"x18" paper sharpie markers colored pencils Crayola markers packet of graffiti letters (reference)

Procedure (what you need)

1. Introduce students to different types of graffiti. Where do you usually see graffiti? Why does graffiti get a bad reputation? Show students graffiti artists and work that has been done in a positive way. (powerpoint) After students have seen powerpoint show them youtube video of graffiti artist.

2. Have students brainstorm what word they would like to do for their graffiti. (First name, last name, appropriate words ? peace, love)

3. Hand out packet with different styles of graffiti in it. Flip through and show students that their letters can be block style, bubbly, or overlap. Demonstrate how to make bubble letters. (Draw the letter and then make an outline around the letter, erase letter on the inside.) Demonstrate how to overlap letters on the board. (Drawing letters and erasing the line that is in the middle.)

4. The students will then choose a type of graffiti they would like to make and begin drawing their word of choice. If students would like to use a word other than their name they need to have it approved.

5. After students have made all letter of their word, they will have the option to sharpie over their lines. THIS IS NOT A REQUIREMENT.

6. After the students have outlined their lines in sharpie or opted out of this step the students will then use colored pencils to color in their graffiti project.

7. Remind students that they should use contrasting colors for their graffiti and background!

8. When students are finished they will complete an art rubric for the project and hand in.
