"A Flying Tiger alumni, Greg "Pappy" Boington was the top scoring Marine ace in WW2. Commanding VMF-214, the "Black Sheep," Boington had 25 kills flying the F4U Corsair. Pappy would regularly fly the planes in the worst shape so that younger, less experienced pilots would stand a better chance in the newer planes. Pappy was eventually shot down and thought killed in action. He was, however, captured by the Japanese and spent the rest of the war as a POW. He was later awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor."

"The American Volunteer Group (AVG) served with distinction, fighting for the Republic of China against the Japanese invaders in their P40 Warhawks. Out equipped and outnumbered, the AVG fought valiantly and were very successful against the Japanese forces. After their first engagement, the Chinese papers said, "they fought like tigers," and so were born "The Flying Tigers." They would eventually disband and become part of the Army Air Corps, but kept their distinctive shark mouth emblem. One of their best pilots was Chuck Older who would go on to be a judge, and presided over the Charlie Manson trial."
